Rescue and re-home neglected, abused, or otherwise unwanted pets into loving homes, provide shelter in the form of a lean-to or doghouse to outdoor dogs in an effort to keep them dry and warm, provide outdoor dogs with alternatives to chaining, promote the importance of spaying/neutering pets and offer this service to pets in our community, provide information to the public about the negative aspects of pet tethering and assist owners with necessary resources to allow them to keep their pet out of the already over-crowded shelter system.

Wildagainrescue.com: 937-307-9820 Located in Spring Valley, they work to rehabilitate orphaned and injured wildlife and offer wildlife education. Also home to several abandoned or abused farm and companion animals.

SOAR: Sanctuary of Ohio Animal Rescue (and Parrot rescue) 513-460-1390. Website under construction. Located in Blanchester, about 40 minutes south of Xenia. They take in a variety of animals but focus on pet birds.

Humane Society of Greater Dayton: hsdayton.org 937-268-7387

The Humane Society of Greater Dayton is a no-kill facility. They will take in as many animals as they have space for and there will be an intake fee for all animals that are surrendered. If space is not currently available, they will work with you to provide several options, such as placing your pet on a waiting list to enter their adoption program or providing you with other rescues that may have space immediately available. They also have lost and found services and veterinary care. Check their web site for current pricing and availability.

Provides services ranging from adoptions, spay/neuter, pet food, microchipping and Trap-Neuter-Release assistance in several communities. They also offer veterinary care, testing and vaccines.

Greene County Animal Control: greenecountyohio.gov/112/Animal-Control 937-562-7400

Located at 641 Dayton Xenia Rd in Xenia. A county operated shelter with adoptable pets listed on their web site. The dog wardens enforce Ohio's dog-related laws and respond to calls concerning abuse or neglect of dogs & cats. If you want to surrender your pet to the shelter, you should call for details first.

Humane Society of Greene County (HSGC): humanesocietygreenecounty.com 937-376-3001

The HSGC **does not operate a shelter** but is a volunteer nonprofit group not associated with any government entity. They provide low cost spay/neuter services to pet owners in Greene county. The first program is for both dogs and cats and is income based but the second is a monthly S/N cat clinic available to any Greene County resident, regardless of income, caring for outside cats (\$15 for males, \$20 for females). A pet food pantry is available to low income county residents.

The Humane Society also respond to calls regarding potential abuse or neglect of livestock. The Humane Agent on call can be reached at 937-917-4374. You may need to leave a message since they are also volunteers.
